There is a beautiful Polish tradition that the newly ordained priest visits his family home before his first Mass is celebrated. Here he asks for a blessing from his parents in the presence of the community. Once the blessing is bestowed, he then processes with his families and friends to the church and begins preparations for the Holy Mass. This blessing was first given to us in our baptism. "I now trace the cross on the forehead and I invite the parents and godparents to do the same." Every time we celebrate the Holy Mass this greeting is given and received. By this greeting and the people's response, the mystery of the Church, gathered as the Body of Christ, is made present. The Sign of the Cross and the "The Lord be with you - And with your spirit" opens many of the apostolic letters in the New Testament and is given by Christ to the Church. This blessing of the Sign of our Salvation, is offered and received until our journey is complete and we move into eternity. At the funeral liturgy this greeting is added: "Through Baptism, this person died with Christ, may they now share with Him eternal glory." In our spirit, our soul, we hold the mystery of our salvation, the Cross of Christ. May this reminder lead us into union with Christ and each other. God's Peace, Fr. Brian



Notice Regarding Reporting Sexual Abuse of a Minor

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton,

you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-HourChild Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at

www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis . To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator Mary Beth Pacuska at 570-862-7551.
