From Genesis and the Fall of Adam and Eve to the present time we have been in a time of Salvation History, as was discussed a couple weeks ago. The first reading in the Liturgy of the Word focuses on the beginnings of that journey. Outside of the Easter Season, we see this pursuit of God for His people from the Old Testament during Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation. During the Easter Season and at times during weekday Mass we experience this pursuit within the beginnings of the Church, most particularly in the Acts of the Apostles. In the Old Testament there are five big sections of God's love for His people: The Torah (the first five books), History of God's People, Wisdom Literature, Major Prophets and Minor Prophets. This is also where books were removed during the Protestant Revolution in the 1500's. These seven books (Baruch, Judith, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Sirach, Tobit and Wisdom) are referenced by Jesus during His public ministry and still used in the Catholic Church today. The Acts of the Apostles is a continuation of St. Luke's Gospel. It tells how the Church Jesus founded and sent the Holy Spirit upon on that first Pentecost lived His message and missionary zeal. So why is it important to know this history? First is that the History of Salvation is not a direct path to salvation. It has many turns toward and away from God. It is filled with wonder and despair. Secondly, no matter how unfaithful God's people

have been, God is always faithful. Though there are times in the Old Testament when He states He is done, God never gives up on redeeming the world. Third, is that our world today is still the world of the early Church and we are still on this journey of love. We can fantasize and glorify the past; but when we know our history we have greater hope for our future. God's Peace,
