Hospital and Homebound: Please call the office for First Friday or Anointing.


Priesthood and Religious Life: Contact our priests for an appointment.

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati

The ultimate goal of any journey is to know where a person is traveling. Several months ago we used the analogy of this journey as the Holy Mass meeting us where we are and leads us closer to our ultimate goal, Heaven. However, along this journey we need to be reminded that Heaven is ultimately our goal. This reminder is not only needed for our journey but for the journey of the early Church as well. The third reading of the Liturgy of the Word, the fourth of the Holy Mass, is given for our encouragement. In this reading we listen to the letters of the apostles. Even during the Easter Season, we read a letter, the Book of Revelation. "John, to the seven churches in Asia: grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne." (Rev. 1:4) Through these letters the Church is reminded of several key issues. The first is that we are not alone on this journey. We are accompanied by Jesus, the Holy Spirit, and the entire Church. The second is that our ultimate goal is in the arms of God. That we are not meant for this world but rather for the world to come. And third, that our salvation is attainable through God's grace and our working with His grace. The works we do is because of the grace of God we have received. Without such grace we would be lost along this journey and worn out from it. The majority of these letters are from St. Paul. However, other letters circulate in and out of the Sunday readings and are heard as the primary reading during the weekday Mass. How do these writers know that the goal is

attainable? Because like Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati they lived in relationship with the one who is "the way, the truth, and the life." As Blessed Frassati is quoted, "To live without faith, without a heritage to defend, without battling constantly for truth, is not to live but to 'get along'. We must never just 'get along'." This encouragement leads us to our ultimate guide, The Word of God. God's Peace,

100th Anniversary Merch T-shirts and Ornaments


These shirts will be available at the parish office! We have a variety of sizes and, if we run out, we will order more!
